



Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning

In Nursery, we have really enjoyed our story of the week, Walking Through the Jungle. We used jungle animals to count, made elephant ears for a listening walk and masks to role play.

Our story next week is Goldilocks and The Three Bears and our song is When Goldilocks went to the House of the Bears. All children will bring home a copy of the words to help you to have a sing-a-long at home.







Reception children have been learning about Lunar New Year. We used materials in the creative workshop to make our dragon puppets.

This week ,Class One took part in a drama workshop on weather. They explored making movements for the different types of weather and pretending they were in different weathers e.g. making snow angels and throwing snow balls. They heard a bit about climate change and how we need to look after the world. As a class, we have also looked at the weather for a week and recorded our findings including the temperature.

In Class Two, we have been learning how to give a set of instructions in computing. We instructed our class robot (Miss Miguel) on how to make a jam sandwich and when doing so, we had to make sure that these instructions were precise and if an error occurred, we had to debug the robot. Following this activity, we went outside in pairs and instructed our partner how to get from one spot to another with precise instructions. In science this week, we have been learning to identify materials and describe the uses of everyday materials.







Class 3 were visited by a geologist (Ben Hedley). The children explored how rocks are formed and then went on to investigate and explain fossil formation. We even got to make some of our own fossils. The children enjoyed questioning the rock expert!

What a wonderful week of learning in Class 5! We have worked extremely hard to understand how to use long multiplication and can now multiply a two digit number by a four digit number, working out partial products and then finding a total. In English, we have continued to develop our understanding of parts of speech as well as embellishing our setting descriptions in order to create outstanding story openers. In Science, we have continued to delve deeper into 'Properties of Materials', learning why specific materials are used in the manufacture of everyday objects. Well done Year 5! Keep being the best that you can be!

Class 6 have been developing their descriptive narrative writing based on the book called 'The Viewer' by Shaun Tan . By using a range of noun phrases and relative clauses, we have been describing the setting for the story. To ensure we immerse our readers into the setting we had to study the picture very carefully, and select precise vocabulary that totally captures the scene.
