Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning

Reception Class enjoyed celebrating World Book Day this week. We loved reading with our parents and carers and taking part in the book day costume parade.

Class 1 had so much fun on World Book Day and did a lot of reading for pleasure. We have started a new English text The Town Mouse and the Country Mouse which links to our new Geography topic. As a result we have been exploring what things we might find in the city or in the countryside. Class one also went on a bug hunt in the garden to see what insects they could find and then we looked at naming the body parts of the insect.

This week in Class 2, we have been learning how to count an amount of money in a variety of ways in our maths lessons. In computing, we have been learning how to ask questions and sort and classify data to create branching diagrams. In pairs, we used a pre-made branching diagram on minibeasts to try to identify the minibeast that our partner was thinking of and took turns in doing this.







In addition to reading lots of books on World Book Day, Class 3 have also started our new text 'Romulus and Remus' in English. This links to our history unit 'The Romans'. In History, we have looked at maps and produced our own historical timelines to help us understand when the Romans lived and the duration of their empire.

Class 4 children are continuing to enjoy their swimming lessons and keeping fit and active during their cycling time and PE lessons.

Class 5 have worked extremely hard this week, focusing on converting mixed numbers into improper fractions in Maths and writing from another person's viewpoint in English. They spent time developing their understanding of chronology in History, placing key world events in the correct order and revisiting the meaning of BC and AD.

They shone brightly on World Book Day, setting a wonderful example to Year 2, reading patiently with them, using encouraging words and lots of praise. Thank you to all the Class 5 parents who came to read with the class. It was such a pleasure to have you all with us.



Class 6 have had a busy week this week and have been working hard. We have been mastering our decimal skills in maths and solving problems using decimals. In geography, we have been comparing and describing different types of settlements that be found around the world. We have learnt which natural site factors may influence an early settler.
