

The eggs will be arriving in school today and will be kept in an incubator so that they are kept in the right conditions and hopefully our chicks will be born in the next month or so!






Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning

It has been lovely welcoming new children and families to Early Years. The children have ben enjoying listening to the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and have been very happy to be reunited with their Nursery friends

In Reception we have been learning about Eid. We made some colourful Eid cards to take home.

Class 1 have been exploring weight and mass in Maths. They have been able to say which items are heavier or lighter when then looked at items on a balance scale. In Science they have been learning about two new groups of animals; reptiles and amphibians. Where the Wild things are is our new class English text and the children have loved looking at the pictures.

This week in Class 2, we have started our new English text which is called 'Tell Me a Dragon' by Jackie Morris. We created our own dragons by drawing the outline of them and then painting them with watercolours. In science this term, our topic is young gardeners and mini worlds. We started the topic off by learning the names of different parts of a plant and understanding their uses.






Class 3 have started their new text 'Into the Forest' by Anthony Browne. We have really enjoyed exploring the book, making links to other books and beginning to describe the features of a forest. In addition, our new science unit is 'Plants' and we are planning to explore the school grounds for a variation of plants.

This week class 4 started reading the book *Gorilla* by Anthony Browne. We looked closely at a couple of images from the book and used these to make inferences about the main characters thoughts and feelings. We used drama techniques to role play how the main character was feeling at a certain point in the story, and made predictions about what might happen next.









Class 5 have had a fabulous start to the Summer Term. In English, they began reading 'The Princess Blankets', making predictions about the narrative and writing stories of their own on the same theme. In Maths, they worked hard to complete their module on 'Perimeter and Area' and are now adept at using their rulers. In Science, they began to explore different life cycles, in preparation for their upcoming trip to Generation Wild, next week.

Class 6 have read the class text called Way Home by Libby Hathorn. It is a story about an exceptional boy who forms a friendship with a cat. Together they take their journey through a city and encounter various facets of urban life. We have had some wonderful discussions about feelings, poverty and wealth, self reliance and how the author engaged us in the story using imagery.
