During their gardening session with Ms Harvey, Reception children observed Calendula (also known as Pot Marigold) flowers and seeds. After looking at grapes from our allotment, they then planted Muscari bulbs (also known as blue grape hyacinth) and carefully watered them.





Year 3 and 4 children have been busy sieving compost this week at their lunch time gardening club. They removed larger pieces of bark and sticks (which would take a long time to decompose naturally) to enable the worms to pass the soil through their bodies.

Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning

The Reception children have made a great start to their phonics lessons using our new phonics scheme 'Little Wandle Letters and Sounds'. We have learnt the sounds s, a, t and p and have found objects that begin with these sounds. We have practised writing the letters that make these sounds too. Next week we will be learning the sounds i, n, m and d.





Class 1 children have been enjoying exploring our fabulous garden at Normand Croft. They went on a Science senses walk to see what they could find. The giant pumpkins were a favourite. They have started a new phonics programme (Little Wandle Letters and Sounds) and have been enjoying learning the new expressions with the digraphs.

In science this week, Class 2 have been discussing the different changes that exercise can cause to our body including short and long-term effects. We also discovered how to feel our pulse to understand how our heartbeat changes prior to and during exercise. In English this week, we have been learning to retell our story of 'Jack and the Baked Beanstalk' and have been using actions to help us remember the whole story.

In Class 3, we have been doing lots of work for our English unit 'The Frog Prince'. In order to learn the structure of the story, we have created story maps which included all the main events.







Class 4 have been finding out about how to keep our teeth healthy and avoid cavities and tooth decay. As well as brushing at least 2x a day for 2 minutes, we found other ways such as flossing, visiting the dentist, eating and drinking less sugary foods/drinks and using a toothpaste with fluoride. We recorded the information we found out into a handy poster for others to read.

This week in Class 5, we have continued our work on The Highwayman, working on describing a setting and adding to our vocabulary with words from the poem itself. We also had the most amazing music lesson, playing ukuleles for the very first time! We had wonderful discussions in Science about whether we could prove that the world was spherical and finished creating our own planets.

As part of our maths work, Class 6 have been reading, writing and ordering numbers up to 10 million. We tried to beat each other by trying to make the biggest and smallest numbers using certain digits and then found what was 10 times and 1 tenth of the size of the numbers we made. We were all very good at it!

Thank you to all our parents/carers who attended our meet the team meetings. We look forward to working in partnership with you this year.
