Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning

In Reception we went to the wild garden area to release our butterflies. Some of them flew away straight away and some of them stayed with us for a little while longer. We learnt all about butterfly lifecycles and sang some butterfly songs.



Class 1 were very excited to visit the Natural History Museum. They looked at various different mammals, fish, reptiles, birds, and amphibians. They were very knowledgeable and pointed out the features of the animals they knew. The loved having a picnic all together and the bus ride to and from the museum. The highlight at the end was of course seeing the dinosaurs.

In Class 2, we have been learning all about fractions. We have learnt how to recognise and find a half and a quarter of an amount in different ways. In our morning work, we have also been learning how to tell the time and have focussed on o'clock and half past. In English, we started our non-chronological report which is based on growing plants. The children have been using subheadings, paragraphs and scientific vocabulary to complete this piece of work.

Following on from our in school Ballet workshop a few weeks ago, last Friday, Year 4 were given the opportunity to go to the London Children's Ballet to watch their performance of Snow White. Both the staff and the children enjoyed this wonderful experience.

Year 4 have also recently completed the Architecture in Schools programme. They spent the day with architects from Shepherd Robson, designing and constructing a building that could be used as part of the Earls Court Development Project. They had a great morning learning how to draw detailed plans to scale, and then spent the rest of the day using various materials to create 3D models of their designs.

Year 5 have had an incredible week! On Tuesday, they explored their creative side at IntoUniversity, where they spent the whole day discovering what studying The Arts at university would be like. They honed their acting skills, tried their hand at photography, identified the symbols of Aboriginal art and learnt to recognise unusual instruments just by listening to them. On Wednesday, they were treated to a talk on Viking mythology where they learnt about Valhalla. This Friday, both Year 5 and Year 6 will be spending the day at Kidzania, practising life and communication skills. This week, Class 6 have been continuing their history work and have been finding out more about the Vikings. We learnt that the word Viking means 'a pirate raid', which is a fitting name as they were fearsome warriors and often raided monasteries for treasure. However, by understanding how our knowledge of the past should be constructed from a range of sources we also learnt that they weren't all bad, bloodthirsty and violent - they also settled with their families and farmed the land peacefully for many years. We were also very lucky to have Cecilia Weiler, an expert on Vikings, come into our school to talk to us about her findings.
