## Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning

Class 1 have continued to work on their understanding of money. They have been counting coins and we have been doing lots of 'shopping' in class one. They have been using their skill of counting in 2s, 5s and 1os and using it when counting the coins. In geography they have continued to explore what a wonder of the world is and hear about the wonders in our world. They are now explaining if it is a physical feature or a man-made feature.

This week in Class 2, we have been learning how to make a paper weave in art and design. This links to our 'Grace & Family' book that we have been learning about in geography as we have been learning about Africa and weaving originates from there. In music this week, we have been learning how to play different chords on our glockenspiels. We have even learning the chords 'E' and 'B' to play music. We first practiced with our pairs before performing in front of the whole class.







As part of Class 3's Fly Eagle Fly unit in English, we have been working in groups to re-enact the full story. We had lots of fun performing in front of the class, using our best voices and articulating all our words! There are certainly a lot of natural performers in Class 3.







This week, Class 4 took part in a workshop with Into University. We talked about different careers and role played how to be a Civil Engineer, a Palaeontologist and how to design a product based on a specific brief. This week in Maths, Class 5 have learnt all about complements to 1. They put on their Mr Bounce hats in order to think about the many ways in which 1 can be made, using tenths, hundredths and thousandths. They then converted their answers into decimals. Well done Year 5! In English, the children wrote their penultimate Big Write, focusing on using dialogue as a tool to develop a narrative. Guided Reading continued to move on at a pace, as the children explored more tales from '1001 Arabian Nights'.

On Tuesday, Class 6 went to 5Km running competition at Linford Christie stadium. They were split into two teams and had to compete against 14 other schools from Hammersmith and Fulham. They each had to run 100m on the track, pass the baton to their team member until they had completed 5Km between them. That was 12 laps around the 400m track! Both teams did so well that they got into the final ( the only school to do so) and had to do it again! Our blue and red team came 3rd! We were very proud of them. They were all so determined to do well. They are certainly the best runners in the borough.
