Rhyme Time in Nursery







Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning







This week Reception have been learning about Diwali, the festival of light. We made our own diva lamps using clay and we are looking forward to decorating them when they are dry.

Class One has started their history topic, toys over time. They were very excited to start by exploring different toys that they have in their homes. We looked at the materials they were made out of and had a go at sorting them into groups depending on whether they were old toys or new toys. In English they have been writing questions about our new story 'Traction Man' by Mini Grey.







This week in Class Two, we have been learning how to write a letter using commands, questions and exclamations. In cooking, we have made a broccoli soup by chopping up vegetables, boiling them and finally blending all the ingredients together. We also learnt how to use knives safely to chop up food. Furthermore, got to see double cream being whisked into butter!

Classes 3 and 4 have been exploring the history of our local area as part of our unit on the Victorians. In addition to looking at maps from the past, we went on a local area walk to examine different buildings. We looked at common features of Victorian houses and compared them to those built more recently.







Class 5 have had yet another fantastic week. In Mathematics they have been making links between multiples, common multiples and factors. Whilst in Literacy, they have been showcasing their creative skills, writing newspaper articles to persuade people to move to a different planet as well as creating diamante poems inspired by Vincent Van Gogh's 'The Starry Night'. In music, they learnt how to play the beginning section of 'I'm Yours' by Jason Mraz. Bravo Year 5!

This week class 6, in computing , have been researching unfamiliar animals that can be found around the world. We had to think of specific questions to find the information we needed. We then used the information we found and our scientific knowledge to decide where they belong in the classification system and presented it on a google slide. We discovered there are some very strange creatures out there!
