## Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning

Children in Early Years settled back into routines very well this week. They have enjoyed listening to the story 'Room on a Broom and creating with different perfumes and potions! Katrine was turned into a frog!

Class One listened to a talk about Antarctica this week. We were excited to learn more about various animals and see real life pictures and videos. We have started our new English text 'Traction Man is Here'. The children have been asking questions and predicting what they thought would happen in the story. In History, we started our topic toys over time and the children were excited to bring in a toy from home for us to compare.







This week in Class Two, we have started our cooking lessons and have learnt how to cook mini pizzas. First, we had to make the dough before then choosing our toppings and finishing them off by putting them in the oven. In addition, we started our history topic about famous Victorians. We have been finding out about the life of Queen Victoria and have been placing important events in the order that they took place on a timeline.

This week, Class Three have started a new book in English called 'Egyptian Cinderella'. We worked in groups to design character puppets. Once we had created our puppets, we spent time acting out and role playing the different scenes within the story of Egyptian Cinderella in order to support our understanding of the events within the story.



In English, Class Four have been writing a narrative about a storm. In Maths, they have learnt to add and subtract very big numbers and in Science, they pretended that they were apples and wrote about their journey through the digestive system. Well done Year 4, you are amazing!

Children in Years Five and Six took part in an athletics competition at Sacred Heart Girls' School. The children were awarded a special mention for demonstrating our shared values whilst representing our school. Starting Reception We hope that you will choose Normand Croft as your child's Primary School.

If your child was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020, they will be starting reception in primary school from September 2024. The application process opened on 1 September 2023 and closes on 15 January 2024. The national offer day is 16 April 2024.
