'Thank you for letting us go into the big playground and letting us have the ball.'


'Thank you for being kind, cool and keeping us safe.'



## Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning

This week in Nursery we have been reading The Gruffalo. The children have had lots of fun singing The Gruffalo song, dressing up and retelling the story using props and puppets. Also this week, the children have been painting autumn trees, making snakes and trying to figure out which objects would float and which would sink in our water tray.







Reception Class made some beautiful rangoli patterns and listened to some stories to learn how Hindus and Sikhs celebrate Diwali. They have also been practising their counting skills!

In Class 2, we had a visit from the famous Victorian, Mary Seacole! We learnt what a doctress is, the adventures Mary went on throughout her life, the obstacles she faced and overcame and also, about the building of 'The British Hotel'. Furthermore, in art last Friday we started sketching our poppies for Remembrance Day. We learnt all about what Remembrance Day is and the symbol of the poppy. This week, we used watercolours to fill in our poppies and learnt how to create different shades of a colour by mixing in white to make it lighter.







In Class 3 we have continued our cooking lessons. This week we made leek and potato soup with croutons! We really enjoyed preparing the vegetables, boiling the soup, breaking the bread and using the equipment safely with confidence.

This week in Class 4, we have been consolidating our understanding of exchanging in Maths. In English, we have planned another Big Write, focusing on the story of 'Egyptian Cinderella' and in History, we have enjoyed making information wheels about farming along the River Nile.

For anti-bullying week, Class 5 have been discussing the definition bullying ("the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group where the relationship involves an imbalance of power") and using this to give examples of bullying behaviour. This year, as the theme is around 'making a noise', we discussed ways we can all stand up against bullying especially by speaking to a trusted adult when we witness or experience it ourselves.

This week Class 6 have been using geography skills in their field work to investigate the weather. Using our weather station in the Normand Croft garden we compared the temperature forecasts with the actual temperature on our weather thermometer in school. We had to carefully observe, measure and record the data and present the results in a line graph.
