# Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning

This week in Nursery we have been reading Owl Babies. The children have been learning all about owls and other nocturnal animals. They made a huge collage using paints, finger paints, feathers and sticks, and practised retelling the story with puppets and other props.



Reception children continue to impress us with their enthusiasm during phonics sessions. They have enjoyed learning about the festival of Diwali.

For History, Class 1 had a visit from Miss Jackson who brought some VERY special teddies with her. She showed the children her Mummy's teddy, her teddy and her son's teddy. The children observed the differences and similarities and had a look at how they have changed over time. They noticed how the older toys were now a bit worn out so we had to be very careful with them!



This week in Class 2, we had a virtual history workshop where we were learning who Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale were, all that they achieved in their lifetime and why they are remembered today. We even got to learn some Makaton signs, such as ships and horseback, when discussing how people travelled during the Victorian Era and how it's different from travel today. In English, we started our new story called 'The Tale of Peter Rabbit' by Beatrix Potter who is also a famous Victorian. We have been learning how to describe Peter Rabbit using expanded noun phrases and have been learning how to improve sentences. This will support us with writing our character description next week.

This week Class 3 went to the British Museum as part of our history unit on the Ancient Egyptians. We saw some mummies, a sarcophagus, a female sphinx and lots more! We enjoyed our time in Holborn and learnt lots about Ancient Egyptian life.



Class 4 also went to the British Museum as part of their History topic, 'Ancient Egyptians.' They were well behaved, inquisitive and delightful to be around. They had a wonderful time looking at Egyptian artefacts and making detailed sketches of sarcophagi and stone sphinx. Well done to all the Class 4 historians!

This week Class 5 have being finding out about the Ancient Greeks. They became historians by looking at a selection of artefacts and asking questions about them. They thought about what the artefacts could be, what they might have been used for and what clues they could give us about life in Ancient Greece.

Class 6 have had a busy week this week. As part of their into university experience they have been studying engineering. They investigated different structures and designed and made bridges that had to be strong enough to hold at least 5 dictionaries. As you can tell they were very successful! They also attended a rocket workshop at the science museum and on Friday graduated at Roehampton University. They were all very proud of themselves. Well done Class 6!
