Starting Reception 2024




If your child was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020, they will be starting reception in primary school from September 2024.

Be Safe, Be Kind, Be The Best That You Can Be Early Years and Primary Learning

Children in Early Years have enjoyed listening and joining in with the story 'Stickman' by Julia Donaldson. They have used a range of materials to make their own stick people. Some were long and some were short. We think they look wonderful!









Class 1 went on a class history trip to Fulham Palace. We had a talk about toys through time and the children were able to look at examples. They had a go at trying to predict which era some toys were from. We explored the materials that each toys were made from. The children were able to look at and delicately touch a Victorian doll whose face was made out of china.

This week in Class 2, we have been learning to retell the story of 'A Tale of Peter Rabbit' by Beatrix Potter. We have been learning some sentences with actions from the story. Also we have been learning to extend and improve sentences from the story by adding in expanded noun phrases, conjunctions and adverbs. Furthermore, in history this week we have been organising the events that took place in Mary Seacole's life in chronological order on a timeline. We have also been learning to identify what she is famous for and her achievements in her life.









In Class 3, we have begun our unit on multiplication and division in maths lessons. The children have enjoyed making arrays using cubes and drawing a variety of arrays pictorially. Any times tables practice at home would be welcomed, particularly 2s, 5s and 1os! Enjoy!

This week Class 4 have worked really hard on consolidating their understanding of number and estimation in Maths. During English lessons, they practised forming a balanced argument in order to answer the question, 'Should Zeraffa the Giraffe be sent to Paris or should she stay in Africa?' To further their understanding of the ancient Egyptian belief system, they began making their own King Tut masks. Well done Class 4!









Class 5 have been continuing to find out about the legacies of the Ancient Greeks. They researched how the Olympic games first started and compared them to the Olympics we still hold today. We found some similarities and quite a few differences - some of these were quite amusing!

This week, as part of their topic on Odysseus and the Ancient Greeks, Class 6 have completed letters to Odysseus from his adoring wife, Penelope. They got into character and wrote heartfelt letters which were wonderful to read. Next week we are going to meet the Cyclops!
