This week in Nursery we have been reading the story *Mr Wolf's Pancakes*. On Tuesday the children tasted lots of different pancake toppings (sugar, maple syrup, lemon and strawberries) and voted which one they liked the best. In maths, we have been focussing on number 5, and have had lots of fun singing "5 little speckled frogs" and "5 little men in a flying saucer". This week we will be sending home our new class teddy called Oakley. He is very excited to be going home for the weekend with one of our Nursery children. We can't wait to hear about Oakley's adventures on Monday.







We have been learning to use watercolour paints in Reception this week and have been painting some beautiful pictures for our class gallery. In Class 1, the children started their Geography topic, What is it like where we

In Class 1, the children started their Geography topic, What is it like where we live? We have started thinking about the location of our school and have looked at an aerial photograph of it as well as a map. We have had our last cooking lesson where the children were delighted to use a spiraliser to make their apple puffs.

This week in Class 2, we have been learning how to sort 2D shapes into groups depending on their properties. Also, we have been learning how to draw lines of symmetry on 2D shapes. In English this week, we have been reading our new text called 'Claude in the City' by Alex T. Smith. We have been making predictions, sequencing the story and describing Claude's appearance and personality using expanded noun phrases.

This week, Class 3 have enjoyed exploring our new English text, Stone Age Boy. This text is associated with our history topic this half term - the Stone Age. In history, the children created their own timelines, placing a range of historical events in chronological order.

Class 4 have had a wonderful start to the second half of the academic year. They have begun reading 'Stone Age Boy' in English and are already very enthusiastic about working towards writing a diary entry based on the narrative later in the term. In Maths, they have been consolidating their understanding of fact families, using the inverse to check division questions. The have also learnt how to use related facts of multiplication to answer questions that have factors of ten or one hundred times bigger.







Class 5 and 6 thoroughly enjoyed their trip on the iconic London Eye. Despite the rainy weather, they were still able to marvel at all the famous London landmarks of the South Bank including the historic Big Ben! Riding 96 metres above central London was a magical experience. One of the children said, 'After reading the London Eye Mystery story it was great to actually experience the ride itself. This was my best day out!'
