How can families support their children with remote learning?

To best support your child's online learning and progress, we recommend you do the following:

- Engage with and respond to all communication from the school. This includes reading all emails and texts that are sent to parents and answering calls.
- Ensure your child is ready to learn before the start of the school day. This includes making sure your child is awake, has had breakfast and their equipment ready to start learning at 9.00 am
- Make sure your child has a distraction-free environment to learn in. This can include keeping background noises to a minimum.
- Check your child's engagement with their learning.
- Asking your child the following questions will help you connect with what they are learning.

What have you been learning to do today?

What have you found difficult?

Have you made a mistake that has helped you learn?

Can you show me the learning you are most proud of?

What learning will you be doing next?
